Who we are: We are not anti-vaccine. We value the doctor-patient relationship, recognize that no medical procedure is one-size-fits-all, and encourage personal responsibility in healthcare.

Covid-19 has brought informed consent, medical privacy, and vaccine choice to the front and center of a national conversation, while here in Texas our organization has grown from 10,000 to 100,000 members.

Policy Issues:

- School Districts overriding the Governor's orders and violating parental rights
- Hospitals already short-staffed are firing nurses, doctors, and support staff
- Reports from the field suggest data on hospital occupancy is skewed
- Vulnerable patients are not receiving individualized care, but standardized, socialized care
- Insurance companies are dropping coverage for unvaccinated

Concerns from Texans:

- Vaccine failure, additional boosters
- Doctors refusing to treat unvaccinated patients
- Judges ordering vaccination for visitation of children, custody disputes
- Loss of employment
- Medical privacy
- Reporting of vaccine reactions
- Zero liability
